



## Terms & conditions

The following competition rules ("Rules") govern your participation in the Ecclesiastical Church competition Parish Pixels ("Competition") being operated by Ecclesiastical Insurance Office Plc, registered company number 24869 ("Ecclesiastical"). In these Rules the terms "we", "us", "our" and "ours" mean Ecclesiastical and the terms "you", "your", and "yours" mean the person submitting any content or other material to our servers or by post under these rules.

Before submitting any application for entry into the Competition, we strongly advise that you read these Rules carefully. Failure to comply with these Rules could lead to your disqualification without reasons being given or opportunity for challenge.

1. This Competition is open to any Anglican place of worship located in the United Kingdom. Entries must be completed and submitted by an individual aged 18 years or over, who is authorised to act on behalf of the Anglican place of worship entering the competition. There are no restrictions on the age of the photographer.
2. This Competition is not open to anyone other than Anglican places of worship in the UK. Anyone associated in any way with this Competition (whether (a) an employee of Ecclesiastical or its holding or subsidiary companies; (b) employees of agents or suppliers of Ecclesiastical or its holding or subsidiary companies, who are professionally connected with the Competition or its administration; or (c) members of the immediate families or households of (a) and (b) or otherwise) shall not be entitled to enter.
3. All information detailing how to enter this Competition forms part of these Rules. It is a condition of entry that all Rules are accepted as final and that you agree to abide by these Rules. The decision of the judges (acting reasonably) is final and no correspondence will be entered into. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these Rules and that you are agreeing to be bound by these Rules.
4. Entries for the Competition can be submitted until **31 October 2019**. Only one entry may be submitted for each individual place of Anglican worship. No purchase is necessary. We reserve all rights to disqualify you if your conduct is contrary to the spirit or intention of the Competition.
5. Entries must be submitted on the official entry form, which is available at [www.ecclesiastical.com/parishpixels](http://www.ecclesiastical.com/parishpixels). The official entry form must be completed fully and include contact details. The form must be either returned electronically to [churchcompetition@ecclesiastical.com](mailto:churchcompetition@ecclesiastical.com) or can be posted to **FREEPOST ECCLESIASTICAL**. Please note entries will not be returned.
6. Your entry must reach us by 5pm on **31 October 2019** (either by email or post). Late, lost, mislaid, damaged in transit, illegible, incomplete defaced or corrupt entries regardless of cause, including, for example, as a result of any postal failure, equipment failure, technical malfunction, systems, satellite, network, server, computer hardware or software failure of any kind will not be accepted. No responsibility can be accepted for lost entries and proof of posting or transmission will not be accepted as proof of receipt of entry to the competition. Entries must not be sent through third parties or agencies.
7. Photographs must be taken with a standard camera or smartphone; this does not include Polaroid-style cameras. Emailed submissions must include the largest file size of the photo possible and a minimum of 1mb. If you submit a printed photograph, it must be printed on a professional-type printer and be a standard 4" x 6" or 5" x 7" size photo.
8. Entries must be made with the express permission of the photographer, as set out in the entry form, and the photographer must review and agree to these terms and conditions before the entry is submitted.
9. It is your responsibility to ensure that any content submitted in the application has the full backing of your place of worship and does not infringe the copyright of any third party. By entering this competition you warrant that submissions in the entry form constitute your own work and you own any copyright that applies to it.
10. Copyright in all entries for this Competition remains with the respective entrants. However, each entrant grants Ecclesiastical a non-exclusive royalty-free licence to feature any of the submitted entries in any of their publications, websites and/or other promotional material.
11. Once the Competition has closed, our judging panel will consider all eligible submitted entries. The judging panel will be comprised of representatives from Ecclesiastical and representatives from each Region will be included as part of the judging process.
12. The judging panel will determine the Winners of the Competition, which will be based on criteria including (but not limited to):

- Visual impact;
- Originality of the photo; and
- Interpretation of the theme.

The decision of the judging panel (acting reasonably) will be final and may not be challenged.

13. In total, 10 Prizes (each a "Prize" and together "the Prizes") will be allocated as follows:

One winner per Region (as defined in clause 15 below) - one Prize per Region of £1,500 will be awarded to the best entry for each Region – a total of 9 prizes. Together these winning entries will constitute the "Winners" and each a "Winner" of the Competition. The Prizes will be awarded to the church, and will be announced before 29 February 2020.

The Main Prize – the best entry (as determined by the judging panel) will be awarded a cash Prize of £5,000. This will be chosen from the 9 Regional winners, and announced before 31 October 2020 at an Awards Ceremony.

14. Each Prize is non-transferrable, not negotiable and cannot be replaced if lost or stolen or not taken up for any reason.

15. For the purposes of administering the competition we are dividing the UK into 9 Regions. These are:

- **Scotland** – including the following dioceses: Aberdeen & Orkney, Argyll & The Isles, Brechin, Edinburgh, Glasgow & Galloway, Moray, Ross & Caithness, and St Andrews, Dunkeld & Dunblane.
- **Wales** – including the following dioceses: Bangor, Monmouth, St Asaph, St David's, Llandaff, and Swansea & Brecon.
- **North East** – including the following dioceses: Durham, Leeds, Newcastle, Sheffield, and York.
- **North West** – including the following dioceses: Blackburn, Carlisle, Chester, Liverpool, Manchester, and Sodor & Man.
- **East Midlands** – including the following dioceses: Derby, Leicester, Lincoln, Peterborough, and Southwell & Nottingham.
- **West Midlands** – including the following dioceses: Birmingham, Coventry, Hereford, Lichfield, and Worcester.
- **Eastern** – including the following dioceses: Chelmsford, Ely, Norwich, St Albans, and St Edmundsbury & Ipswich.
- **South East** – including the following dioceses: Canterbury, Chichester, Guildford, London, Oxford, Portsmouth, Rochester, and Southwark.
- **South West** – including the following dioceses: Bath & Wells, Bristol, Exeter, Gloucester, Salisbury, Truro, and Winchester.

16. Each Winner will be contacted by phone on the number provided on your entry form following the judging panel's decision and will be notified that they are a Winner before 29 February 2020. A representative from Ecclesiastical will present the Regional winners with the prize at their church following the announcement and subject to

agreeing on a date to present the prize.

17. The announcement of the overall winning prize of £5,000 will be at an Awards ceremony to be held during October 2020. Each of the Regional Winners, amounting to one individual who has made the application on behalf of the place of worship (plus at least one guest each), will be invited to the award ceremony in October 2020 (the "Award Ceremony"). The overall Winner will be announced and be awarded the Prize at the Award Ceremony (with the winners being notified before the end of the month). Details of the date and venue of the Award Ceremony will be announced in due course.

18. If for any reason a Winner is not able to attend the Award Ceremony, Ecclesiastical will make separate arrangements to distribute the Prize to the Winner after the Award Ceremony has taken place.

19. The winning churches may be required to take part in publicity with Ecclesiastical.

20. The Regional Winners may be disclosed to anyone who writes within one month after the winners' announcement in February 2020 enclosing a stamped addressed envelope to Ecclesiastical Insurance Office Plc, Beaufort House, Brunswick Road, Gloucester GL1 1JZ.

21. We reserve the right to amend these Rules at our entire discretion without notice to you, although any such amendments will be posted on Ecclesiastical's website [www.ecclesiastical.com/parishpixels](http://www.ecclesiastical.com/parishpixels) as soon as practicable. We additionally reserve the right to change the judging panel or cancel the Competition without liability to you should we consider it necessary to do so. No correspondence will be entered into.

22. If you are a Winner of the Competition, you agree that Ecclesiastical may use your name, image and details supplied on the entry form to announce the Winners of this Competition and for any other reasonable and related promotional purposes. You further agree to participate in any reasonable publicity required by Ecclesiastical. By entering the Competition, you agree that any personal information provided by you with the Competition entry may be held and used only by Ecclesiastical or its agents and suppliers to administer the Competition.

23. Nothing in these Rules shall limit our liability for death or personal injury caused by our negligence, for fraudulent misrepresentation or for any other liability that cannot be excluded under applicable law. Except as provided above and provided that this clause will not operate as to enable us to refuse to pay or distribute any Prizes to those adjudged as Winners, we hereby exclude all liability of any nature or however arising (including where due to our negligence) to you or any other person in respect of the Competition, including without limitation, any claim you may seek to bring in respect of the loss of a chance should you be unable to upload your entry to our

servers for any reason, or for the loss of a chance to establish or enhance any reputation you may claim to have. Except as provided above, in no event shall our liability to you, however arising, in respect of any Competition exceed the sum of £100.

24. All Competition entries and any accompanying material submitted to us will become the property of Ecclesiastical on receipt and will not be returned. By submitting your Competition entry and any accompanying material, you agree to: (a) assign to Ecclesiastical all your intellectual property rights with full title guarantee; and (b) waive all moral rights, in and to your Competition entry and otherwise arising in connection with your entry to which you may now or at any time in the future be entitled under the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 as amended from time to time and under all similar legislation from time to time in force anywhere in the world. You agree that Ecclesiastical may, but is not required to, make your entry available on its website and any other media, whether now known or invented in the future, and in connection with any publicity of the Competition. You agree to grant Ecclesiastical a nonexclusive, worldwide, irrevocable licence, for the full period of any intellectual property rights in the Competition entry and any accompanying materials, to use, display, publish, transmit, copy, edit, alter, store, re-format and sub-licence the Competition entry and any accompanying materials for such purposes.

25. English law applies and the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts shall prevail.

### Privacy Notice

Your privacy is important to us. We will process your personal data in accordance with the applicable data protection law. We collect your personal data and information that you provide on submission of your entry to the Competition. This personal data and information may include your name, home address and email address, and special categories of sensitive personal data and information, including information in relation to your religion and any other information that you provide when submitting your entry, including personal information about anyone featuring in your entry.

Your personal data and the information submitted with the entry form will be retained and used by us for the purposes of organising and administering the Competition. We may also retain for a reasonable period and use the information we hold relating to you and anyone else featuring in your entry in order to ensure compliance with the Rules surrounding the eligibility of entrants of the Competition. We will only retain your personal data and information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes for which it was collected, as set out above and as detailed in the Rules.

Upon submitting your entry form to us to enter the Competition, you are asked to consent to the Rules of the Competition and to the processing of your personal data and information in accordance with this Privacy Notice, including announcing your name and the name of the photographer on our website (for the purpose of announcing the Winners of the Competition) and sharing all of your personal data and information provided on your entry form with: (i) the judges and organisers of the Competition; (ii) our PR advisers; (iii) the press (for publicity purposes); and (iv) as otherwise provided for in the Rules of the Competition.

You have the right to request a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to ask us to correct any inaccuracies. Under certain circumstances, by law you also have the right to: (i) request erasure of your personal data and information where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it or you have exercised a right to object to the processing of your personal data and information; (ii) request the restriction of processing of your personal data and information; and (iii) request the transfer of your personal data and information to another third party. Please write to the Data Protection Officer whose details are set out above. We will take all reasonable steps to confirm your identity before responding to your request. If consent of processing your personal data is withdrawn then we may be unable to process your entry for the purposes of the Competition.

Where you are providing us with information about a person other than yourself such as the data for anyone featuring in your entry, you agree to notify them of our use of their personal data and obtain their consent to our use of any special categories of personal data such as religious beliefs. You agree that your entry into the Competition is conditional on you providing such notices and obtaining such consents. Any third party whose personal data we use may withdraw any such consent at any time but if consent is withdrawn then we may be unable to process your entry for the purposes of the Competition. We reserve our right to change this Privacy Notice from time to time for example to keep it up-to-date and compliant with legal requirements.
